Qualification facts



About these qualifications

These qualifications are suitable for 14-19 year olds as well as some adults or for learners where English is an additional language and are part of Foundation Learning (FL). Find out more about funding for these and other qualifications on www.cache.org.uk/centres/funding

They are designed to stimulate interest and encourage the learners' understanding of the skills required to care for children and allow Centres flexibility in their offering with a mix of vocational and PSD units. Functional Skills can also be added if required.

They support the learner in preparing for the "next steps" either in training or moving towards the world of work, will be signposted to relevant NOS where applicable and will reflect the themes of Every Child Matters and Early Years Foundation.

Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for these qualifications but learners will need to be at least 14 years of age.

Experience in the workplace

Learners do not need to be working or undertaking practical placements to take these qualifications.

Qualification structure

Learners are able to achieve at both above and below Level 1 as Level 2 and Entry Level (3) units have been included in the qualifications.

Award criteria:

To complete the Award learners must achieve a minimum of 10 credits.

A minimum of 6 credits must be achieved from Group A. The remaining 4 credits can be achieved from either Group A or B.

Certificate criteria:

To complete the Certificate learners must achieve a minimum of 26 credits.

A minimum of 14 credits must be achieved from Group A. The remaining 12 credits can be achieved from either Group A or B.

Diploma criteria:

To complete the Diploma learners must achieve a minimum of 37 credits.

A minimum of 25 credits must be achieved from Group A. The remaining 12 credits can be achieved from either Group A or B.

Credits achieved in the Level 1 Award in Caring for Children can be counted towards the Certificate and the credits achieved in the Certificate can be counted towards the Diploma.

These qualifications also have some common units with the our Entry Level Award and Certificate in Caring for Children (Entry 3) and the Entry Level Award and Certificate in Personal and Social Development (Entry 3) and the Level 1 Award and Certificate in Personal and Social Development. This enables credits and learning to be transferred between all the qualifications.

Assessment

All units will be individually internally assessed using a range of methods which could include: written assignments or tasks such as designing a leaflet or booklet, charts or diagrams or setting up an information board.

The qualifications will be pass or refer and all the assessment criteria for the chosen units must be achieved in order to obtain a pass. The VOC/PSD units can be completed as either Vocational units or PSD units.

Progression

Further progression opportunities will depend on the learner's abilities, but could include a broad range of destinations as outlined in Foundation Learning including:

- GCSFs
- Level 2 units and qualifications
- supported employment
- · independent living.
