About these qualifications

These qualifications are aimed at people considering a career in health and/or social care with adults or children and young people. Each builds on the knowledge gained from the previous qualification. Offered in schools or colleges, they will develop knowledge and awareness of the types of provision in these sectors and the roles played by workers – from principles and values through to health and safety and working with others. There is also an option to take units in more specialised areas such as learning disability, sensory loss or mental health.

They do not qualify learners to work directly with adults, children or young people but provide a starting point for deciding whether a career in the sector is right for them.

Qualification structure

Where units are shared the credits achieved on the award can count towards the certificate and the credits from the certificate can count towards the diploma. This means learners do not need to repeat learning for the units already achieved.

NCFE CACHE Award in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's Settings

To complete the award learners must achieve a minimum of 10 credits. 6 credits must be achieved from the mandatory units in group A and then at least 4 more credits must be gained from the optional units in group B.



NCFE CACHE Certificate in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's Settings

To complete the certificate learners must achieve a minimum of 25 credits. 20 credits must be achieved from the mandatory units in group A and then at least 5 more credits must be gained from the optional units in group B

NCFE CACHE Diploma in Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children's and Young People's Settings

To complete the diploma learners must achieve a minimum of 37 credits. 20 credits must be achieved from the mandatory units in group A and then at least 17 more credits must be gained from the optional units in group B.

Assessment

All units will be internally assessed using a range of methods which could include: written assignments or tasks such as designing a leaflet or booklet, charts or diagrams or setting up an information board.

The qualifications will be pass or refer and all the assessment criteria for the chosen units must be achieved in order to obtain a pass.

Progression opportunities

On completing the qualifications, learners who wish to pursue a career can progress to other level 2 qualifications such as the Level 2 Diploma in Health and Social Care, the Level 2 Certificate for the Children and Young People's Workforce or the Level 2 Certificate in an Introduction to Early Years Education and Care.



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
